

Everyone knows that we have three green flags but we're not stopping there. We are now working extra hard on getting our fourth green flag for Travel.


Earlier this year Sarah Fitzgerald the Travel Education Officer with An Taisce came to our school on Monday the 15th of October to talk to us about Transport.
